Homework and Reading

Thank you all for your efforts in encouraging regular reading, times tables and spelling work at home. The little and often approach definitely helps with fluency in each of these areas, and we are finding that those that use the Lietner technique for spellings retain them better for independent writing (and not just for the test!).

Whilst we are asking that Year 4 children practise their times tables online each week (as often as possible), we would love it if Year 3 also used the links to develop their recall.

Magazines

Our work as artists this term involves the use of collage and we would be very grateful if you have any old magazines, post cards etc at home that you would be willing to send in for us to cut up, please! They can be brought in any time during the first two weeks as we won't need them until week 3.
